The Department of Linguistics offers an interdisciplinary curriculum designed to develop an understanding of the nature and implications of human language. The Linguistics Department provides solid foundations in phonological and grammatical analysis, as well as opportunities to investigate the social, cultural, psychological, and physical aspects of language use.

120 hours (minimum)

Any student earning a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree must complete a minimum of 60 hours in natural, physical, mathematical, and computer science. Please note: courses with an LIN prefix are generally not accepted towards fulfilling this 60-hour requirement. Therefore, be sure to keep this requirement in mind as you choose your course work for the requirements in the major. A complete description of College requirements for a Bachelor of Science degree, including a specific listing of courses applicable to the 60-hour requirement, can be found in the *Arts and Sciences* section of the 2024-2025 Undergraduate Catalog.

Prior to graduation, a Linguistics major must complete the third and fourth semesters of a foreign language (or the equivalent). This requirement does not need to be satisfied before declaring the major or undertaking major course work.
